# Comparative Perspectives on Digital Copyright Reform: Lessons from Abroad and Beyond

Hong Kong is currently exploring the introduction of more stringent copyright laws to reduce unauthorized copying of copyright works on the Internet. This panel also discusses the development and launch of the Creative Commons license in Hong Kong.
