- Participate on artist selection panels and public art design review committees as requested by the CHPAC chair and staff
- Help promote the Public & Cultural Arts Program to the community and represent the Commission at community meetings and dedications

- Oversee the on-going development of the Public Art collection to ensure balance & diversity.
- Attend monthly Commission meetings and carry out assigned responsibilities
- Serve on at least one Public arts Program or CHPAC operations committee as requested by the CHPAC chair and participate in program development and implementation
- Recommend and recruit prospective new commission members
