

After you have created your account, you will receive an email saying that your account has been created. You will need to click "Add your first hive" to begin submitting your hive locations to the map.










Once you have entered the address or manually entered the location, you will see a satellite image of the area you entered. Click on the blue button that says "place hive."

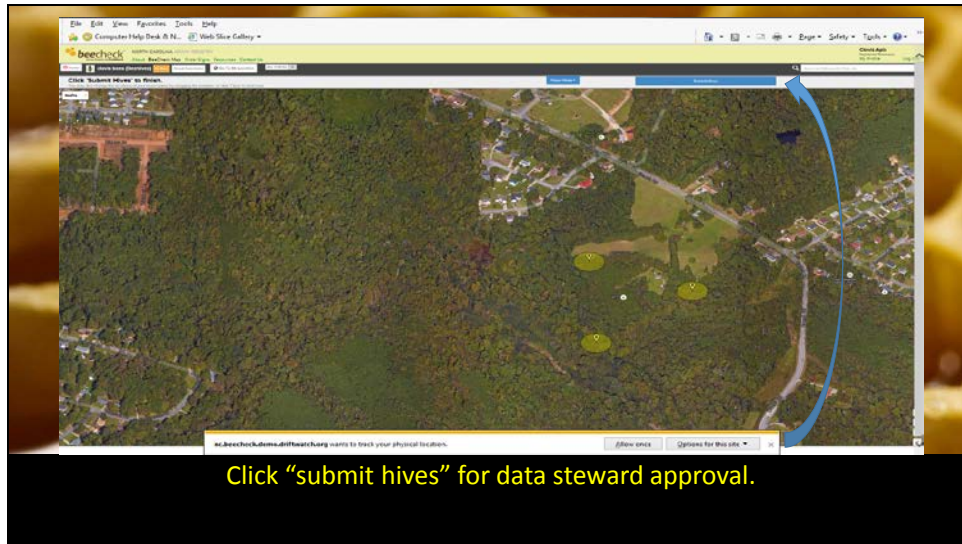
Once you have placed your hives in the appropriate location(s), you will see yellow icons on the map that represent your beehives.
